ROAD SUPERVISOR: Full-time, permanent position in the Jefferson County Road Department. This position is under the direct supervision of the County Commissioners. Position performs administrative and technical duties to plan, coordinate and supervise projects. Coordinates equipment use, evaluates projects costs and works closely with engineers and consultants. Conduct surveys on all county roads; prepares and manages department budget; prepares and up-dates all gravel pits and water use permits; participates in hiring/discipline of staff. Assists the county commissioners in developing and coordinating long range plans. Position must be able to travel extensively within Jefferson County to inspect roads and make immediate on-the-spot assessments. Work is mostly outdoors sometimes in adverse weather. Position is on-call and frequently requires work outside normal working hours. Position requires advanced knowledge of roadway construction; hazards and safety practices; snow removal practices; equipment maintenance; knowledge of computers, budgeting and accounting.
